Hispanic Heritage Month always starts on **September 15**, a historically significant day marking the independence of **five** Latin American countries: Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Nicaragua.

Did you know? People of Hispanic origin are the nation's second largest racial or ethnic group.

The Hispanic population grew **2.4** percentage points over the decade from **16.3%** in 2010 to **18.7%** in 2020.

Over half of Hispanics in the U.S. live in California, Texas, or Florida.

20.8% of Hispanics age **25 and over** had a college degree in 2020.
